What?

Hintonburg Hub is a one-stop-shop (a Hub) to create better access to quality health, housing and social services in the heart of the vibrant Hintonburg Wellington West neighbourhoods. The concept is to have all of these services under one roof. We are currently exploring the Bethany Hope Centre Salvation Army site at the corner of Wellington St. and Rosemount Ave., but if this option is not possible, we would be trying to secure another property in the area.

Who?

This is a partnership of four organizations: Somerset West Community Health Centre, Family Services Ottawa, Citizen Advocacy and Centretown Citizens Ottawa Corporation. Your input matters, and the Hub partners will continue to consult the community as we move ahead with this process.

Why?

Investments in integrated health, housing, and social services play an important role in creating healthy vibrant communities! Hintonburg and Wellington West residents have identified a need for local affordable housing options, medical services, and other essential social services.

What you can do?

We currently need to pressure the City and the Province to provide funding to help the Hub Partners secure the land to create this exciting neighbourhood hub. Contact your local politicians and let them know you support this project.
